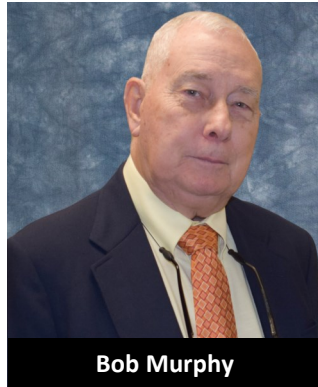

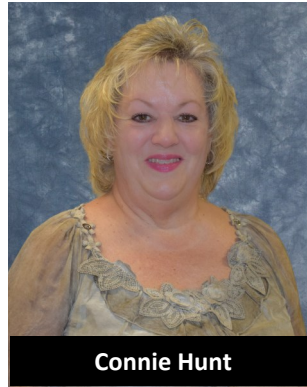

Information Services/Advanced Media

December and January were exciting times for technology in the sanctuary. Our sincerest thanks to David and Michael Canaday for helping bring the majority of what follows to fruition.

- Two hanging area microphones were installed for the choir. This clears up the space in front of the choir and allows the sound to be more consistently good for both in person and virtual worshippers.
- Two area microphones were installed along the sides of the sanctuary. These are specifically for virtual worshippers, allowing them to get a fuller sense of the sound in the whole room. Previously, only the sound going into microphones at the front of the church would have been heard. For things like hymns, call and response liturgy, or laughter during a children's sermon, this improves the virtual worship experience by bringing it closer to the in person experience.
- A new sound board, aka mixer, was installed at the back of the church. This *digital* mixer affords us much more capability and flexibility in many aspects of worship.
- Finally, we added YouTube as a streaming option for virtual worshippers. This may be more convenient for many people, but it is especially helpful for people who are not Facebook members or who happen to be on a device that is not logged in. The link to our YouTube page can be found on our website or by searching for our church within YouTube itself.

As always, we appreciate your feedback on how things are experienced on your end. We rely on you all to alert us to issues you're having and potential problems we may need to address.

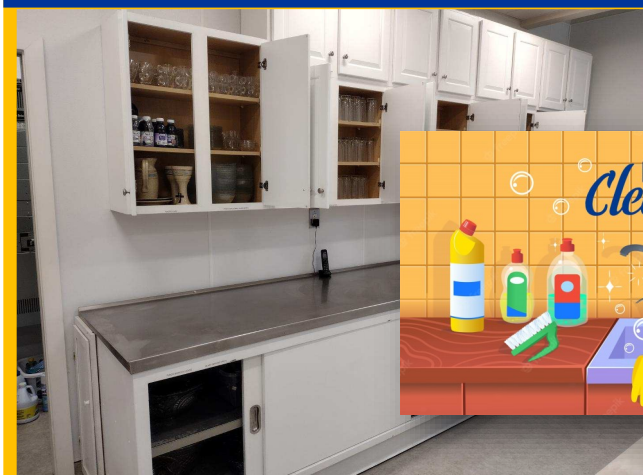

Continue to live with your word day to day:

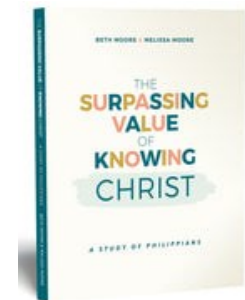
- * Begin to pray that God will enlighten you and point you to what God has to say to you through this word.

Adult Sunday School Class

Outreach



Individual family needs:

PORT

- Hilton Baptist Church, which is hosting PORT currently, reported between 95-100 guests during their last three days.
- PORT has been struggling to pay the extra expense of housing COVID guests during their isolation and illness. That was not an expense that they have been able to get extra funding for.
- PORT is still in need of warm clothing and under garments of any kind—male, female, and children. If you drop off items at the church office, they can be taken to LINK immediately.

DUPC will be hosting PORT March 1-15. Sign ups will start on Sunday, January 29.

DUPC will be responsible for volunteers on one day each week. Volunteers will be needed to sign in guests and their belongings from 6:30 pm - 9:00 pm, set up the beverage tables before dinner, make and serve dinner those nights, and pack breakfast bags to give out the following morning. In addition, we will need volunteers the next morning from 4:30 am - 6:15 am. to get the belonging bags to the guests as they leave. We hope you will be willing to assist in this ministry to help those in need.

Foodbank

- The Lionsbridge Football Club and Food Lion are sponsors and supporters of the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank's mission of meeting the needs of our food insecure community. They will donate 1,000 meals for every goal made during the football season of 2023.

THRIVE

- Seasonal Roots, which is the largest farmer's market in Virginia and Maryland with over ten years of service, has partnered with THRIVE and will now be donating fresh produce every week.
- Collect and roll grocery bags for THRIVE. It's a great way to recycle and save money for THRIVE. If you would like to help, email jen@thrivepeninsula.org and she will get you started.
- THRIVE is one of nineteen recipients of strategic funding to combat violence in Newport News by providing housing support and emergency case management to stabilize at-risk families and deter violent behavior.
- Food Pantry needs: baked beans, canned meat, mixed vegetables, and cereal.

- Current needs: bath towels, body wash, women's deodorant, and zip lock bags (sandwich and quart size)

Red Hand Campaign: End Violence Against Children

According to the organization *End Violence Against Children*, worldwide one in every six children live in conflict zones. Every day these children must navigate extreme risks of violence, psychological trauma, abduction, and abuse. Thousands of these children are caught “in the eye of storm” year after year, recruited and used as soldiers in armed conflicts across the world. The [Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations](#) encourages congregational involvement in the **Red Hand Campaign**. This international initiative seeks to convince countries to stop using children in warfare. The good news is that since 2000 some 170,000 children have been released from armed forces! (<https://www.end-violence.org/articles/red-hand-day>)

The US State Department annually publishes a list of states known to recruit and use child soldiers. The 2022 list includes Afghanistan, Burma, Central African Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo, Iran, Mali, Russia, Somalia, South Sudan, Syria, Venezuela, and Yemen. Russia is a new entry on the 2022 list – the only country to be listed for the first time. Russian-led forces have reportedly used children in combat and support roles in Ukraine since 2014, according to this year’s Trafficking in Persons Report. On February 19, 2023 DUPC will offer a time to write brief messages to these countries’ representatives at the United Nations imploring them to end the use of children as soldiers. Your message is vital and can make a difference in children’s lives.



A Service of Prayer for the War in Ukraine

On February 24, 2022, Russian President Vladimir Putin launched an unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, setting off the largest armed conflict in Europe since World War II. Tragically, the war continues almost a year later. The prayer below is from *A Service of Prayer for the War in Ukraine*.

“Merciful God, we pray for peace as war rages in Ukraine. Shelter all living in fear; protect those seeking refuge in neighboring countries; sustain families separated by the horrors of war; tend to those who are injured; comfort all who mourn their dead. Direct your people into the way of peace. **Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.**

Compassionate God, as Russia wages war in Ukraine, we pray: For all in hiding, searching for safety... For those forced to take up arms... For all journeying to new lands, leaving behind homes and loved ones... For children surrounded by confusion and chaos... For those in Russia who bravely advocate for peace... For journalists risking safety to report on daily events...

For the difficult work of diplomats, world leaders, and international organizations ... For all providing welcome, protection, and sustenance to those who have fled... For medical workers as they attend to the injured... For all grieving those who have died... For any other petitions. **Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.**

Mighty God, your strength comes not by grasping power and might but is poured out in loving service. Support us with such strength to work for peace, to love our enemies, and to trust in your resurrection life even in the midst of pain and death... **Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.**“

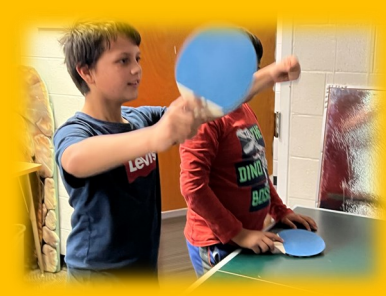

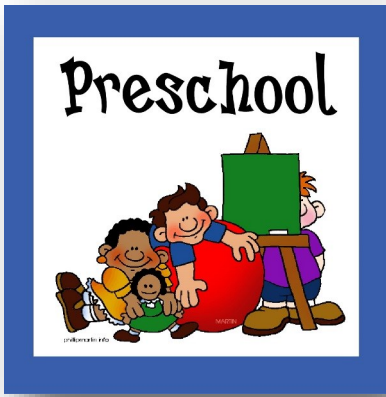

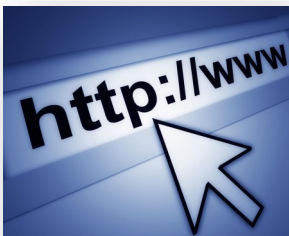
