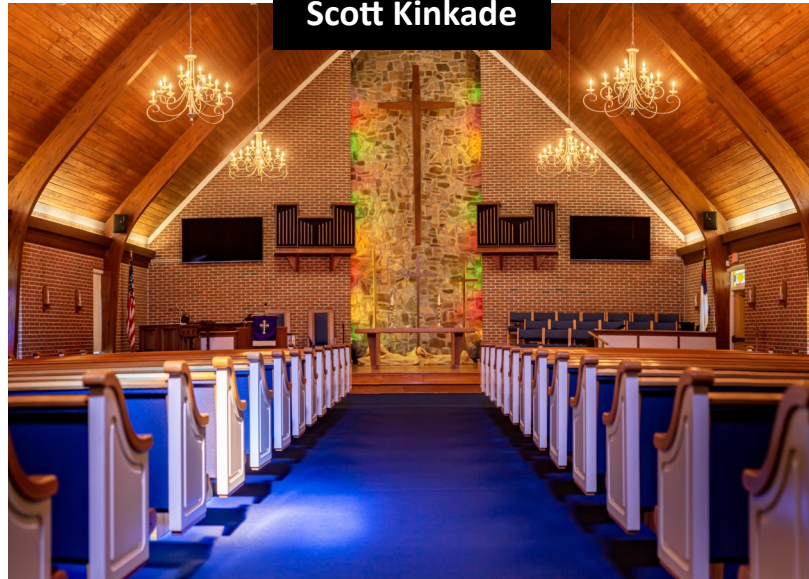

Stewardship—One Great Hour of Sharing

Restoring Hope, Feeding the Hungry, Empowering the Oppressed

Typically received during the season of Lent, each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing supports efforts to relieve hunger through the Presbyterian Hunger Program, promote development through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People, and assist in areas of disaster through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

Restoring Dignity to India’s Most Oppressed

While the economic and social status of women may be improving marginally worldwide, the life of the Dalit women in India remains unchanged. “Dalit” is a word from Sanskrit and Hindi that literally means oppressed or broken. Dalits are forbidden to draw water from the common well and from entering temples. They are given the leftovers thrown away by the higher caste and are barred from the right to education.

Formerly known as “untouchables,” the Dalit women, who make up nearly 16 percent of the female population, face not only gender bias but also caste-based discrimination and economic injustice.

For Smitha Krishnan, this cruel existence was an everyday reality. A trained seamstress, Smitha was left as the sole provider for her family when her husband died just before India’s last tsunami. Not only did she lose her husband, but she also lost their thatched and mud house and everything in it—including her only means of making a living, her sewing machine.

“The destruction of my old sewing machine, which was my only source of income, and the death of my husband, leaving me with five kids to take care of, made life extremely tough for me and my kids,” she said.

Thanks to a grant to provide shelter and sewing machines among other essentials from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to the Society for National Integration through Rural Development, or SNIRD as it’s known, Smitha and her family face a more hopeful future.

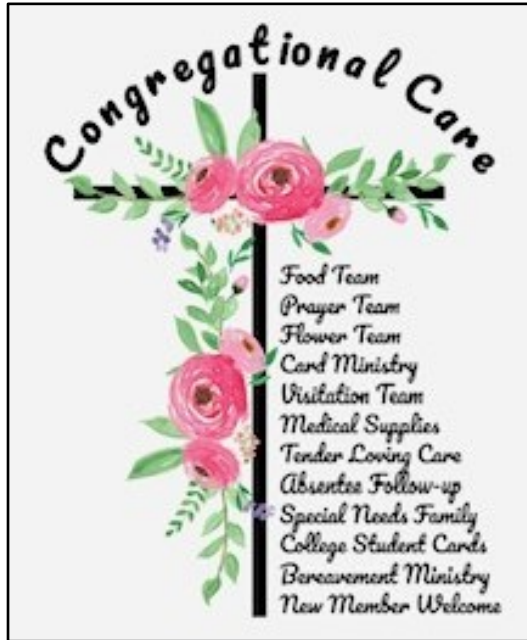

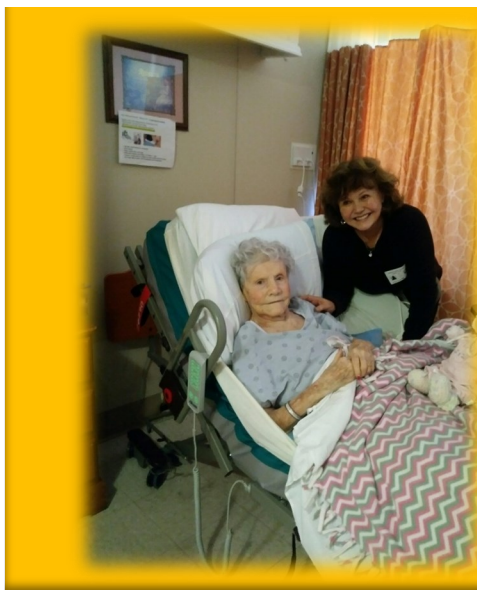

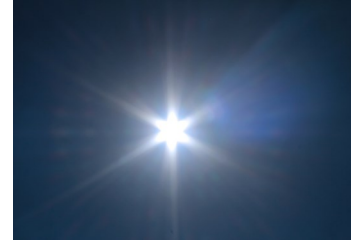

My Star Word—April Reflections



Begin to develop your own thoughts on the word:

- ◆ Journal about what that word means to you.
 - ◆ Do you use that word? Do others around you use it negatively or positively? How has that word been used in reference to you. (Have people said you have that word/trait or that you lack it? Would they use it to describe you?) Do you love your word? Hate your word?
 - ◆ Do an online search or skim the newspaper for news articles that contain your word. Note in your journal what you read and learn through this search. It might seem to have nothing to do with your word.
 - ◆ Read the scripture passages you listed last month. Note in your journal what you read and learn through this search. It might seem to have nothing to do with your word.

What is God saying to you about this word?

- ◆ Why is this word important? Why would it come up in a list of “spiritual” words?
- ◆ Journal about the themes, ideas, or actions that have come up in your study.
- ◆ Make a list of ideas for “living” your star word based on what God’s been saying to you.
- ◆ Holy Week and Easter usually fall in late March or early April. Cut out a cross and write your word on it. Hang it up like the others. Think about what that word has to do with redemption.

Adult Sunday School Class

Ancient Words is an adult Bible study class which meets Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15, currently in the Conference Room. The spring quarter began March 5 and will continue weekly through May 28. Our study this quarter will connect Jesus’ ministry in all four Gospels to the birth of the church in the book of Acts. Participant books are \$7.50 per person plus a small shipping charge. The books are divided into stand-alone weekly lessons in case you can’t be present every week.

Women’s Bible Study Begins on Tuesdays—April 11 at 6:30 p.m.



Join us on Tuesdays at 6:30 p.m. to study Paul’s letter to the Philippians. The evening will feature a large group teaching time, small groups, prayers, and refreshments. The cost of the study book is \$20. If the cost is prohibitive, please receive the book as our gift. The 5-week study will conclude on May 9.

Outreach

People Offering Resources Together (PORT)

DUPC hosted PORT from March 1 - 15. Most of the nights averaged around 90-95 guests, with just a few nights having fewer guests. With one exception, each night after dinner at DUPC, many of the guests were transported to the B site, New Beech Grove Church, where they spent the night and left from there the next morning. DUPC was responsible for check-in from 6:30 p.m.—9:00 p.m., check-out from 4:15 a.m.—6:30 a.m., dinners, and breakfast bags, for all of the guests, for four days. This year, because of the lack of two partner churches, we were responsible for four days instead of two days. The rest of the days were covered by other churches. Since it was never known how many guests there would be on any night, preparations were made for approximately 100-110 dinners and breakfast bags. Luckily, the Salvation Army offered to do dinner for us one night and breakfast bags were provided one day by a wonderful group called Kids United To Help (KUTH). They not only stuffed the bags with good food, but each bag was decorated by the children with drawings and loving words. In addition, a clothing closet was available to the guests for seven days where they could come in and choose some items they would like such as clothing, socks, hats, gloves, under garments, and much needed suitcases. There were also times of an emergency nature for the need of clothing for a guest.

Church members stepped up in other ways. A quilting group made dozens of beautiful hygiene bags, one church member made a baby blanket when she heard about a guest who was pregnant and several ladies, at LINK's request, made 100 new covers for the mats the guests slept on.

There were so many examples of kindness, gratitude, appreciation, and sacrifice between the guests and the volunteers and LINK staff, but one story does stand out. One evening a PORT guest told one of our volunteers she wanted to make a donation to the church. She was escorted by the volunteer to the office and she gave her \$1.84. She assured the volunteer it wasn't all of her money. The guest was also overcome with tears by the kind words of the volunteer about what a joy the baby would be in her life, because no one had ever had any kind words to say about her pregnancy; sacrifice and kindness.

There is an immense amount of appreciation to all of the volunteers from DUPC and the community, for their efforts, time and talents that made this ministry possible. And may God bless LINK for their dedication and empathy in their efforts, for over 30 years now, to provide shelter, food, clothing, resources, and housing all year to our homeless population.

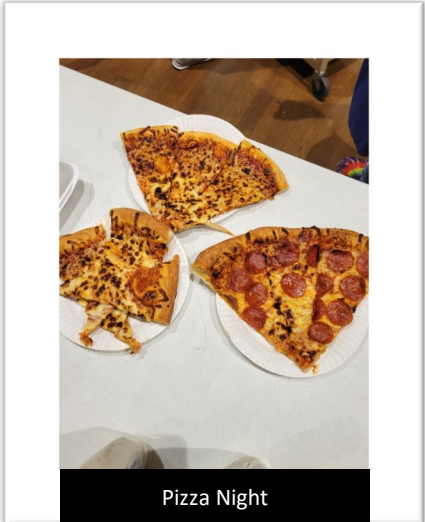
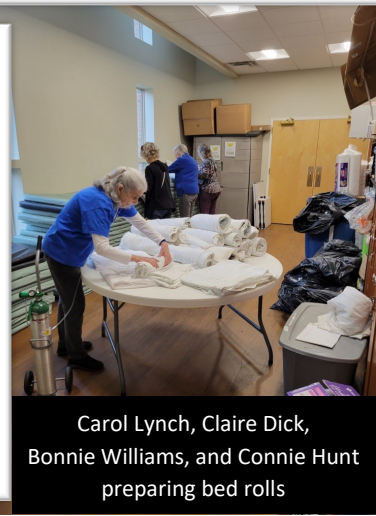


Norovirus Hits PORT and DUPC

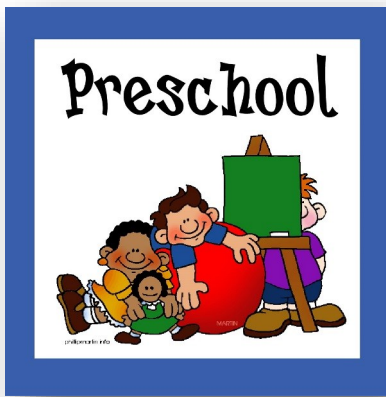
