Onesimus Project Update

In early December, I traveled to Indianapolis, Indiana to attend the "Called to Lives of Meaning and Purpose" annual meeting.

I was privileged to gather with others who have received generous grants for innovative ministries. It was inspiring to hear what God is doing across the nation, and it was inspiring to share what God is doing in our corner of the world here in Newport News. Those who heard our story affirmed our ministries and noted our authentic engagement with our community.

As you will recall, we received a grant of \$16,000 for our Onesimus Project. These funds came from the Lilly Endowment. 1,300 congregations across the U.S. received funds from the Lilly Endowment through the grant titled "Called to Lives of Meaning and Purpose." Thirteen "hubs" (seminaries, universities, and other organizations) channeled funds to the 1,300 congregations. Our "hub" is Fuller Theological Seminary — the seminary from which I graduated. We look forward to carrying out our approved Onesimus Project through the fall of 2023.

Will you prayerfully consider your involvement in two initiatives of this project? One is our Christian sports ministry for children called Upward Soccer. The other is our Learn English/Learn Spanish initiative. These two projects will be funded by the Onesimus Grant along with other activities we have already enjoyed or will enjoy in the coming year.

It is our prayer that more people in our congregation will become involved in connections with our community through Upward Soccer and Learn English/Learn Spanish. We know if may feel daunting, but I can assure you that making these connections will not only bless our community but will also bless you.

Finance—The 2023 Budget

The Session appreciates all the pledges that have been received for the 2023 Operating Fund. At its December meeting, the Session approved a budget of **\$445,031**. We will walk by faith and pray earnestly that these funds will be provided during 2023 so that we can carry out our many missions.

We received \$310,334 in pledges.

Based on historical giving patterns by those who do not pledge but who give, we anticipate an additional **\$35,000** in giving.

We plan to draw up to \$16,700 from designated funds and "other income."

We may need to use up to \$82,997 from our savings/investments if additional funds are not contributed.




Fellowship



Adult Sunday School Class

The winter quarter of the Ancient Words Adult Bible study class will begin December 4 and continue through February 26, 2023. The class meets in the Conference Room Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15 a.m. Our study will focus on God's calling which is rooted in grace rather than merit. This study will include books in the Old and New Testaments and is for the novice as well as long-time readers of the Bible. Lessons are divided into weekly units in case you can't attend every Sunday in the quarter. All adults are welcome to join the conversation and participate in the conservation of Bible study.

Women's Bible Study Is Back in February

We will once again offer a Women's Bible Study for those in our church and our community. This year's study will be a study of Philippians titled *The Surpassing Value of Knowing Christ*. More details are forthcoming.



Trigger - the Ripple Effect of Gun Violence

Fifteen people registered for the recent four-week study

Trigger - the Ripple Effect of Gun Violence. The video tells stories of gun violence from the viewpoints of family members who lost loved ones, a trauma surgeon, a hospital chaplain, a police detective, a school guidance counselor, children who lived with violence, a university researcher, activists and pastors. We usually had from 10-15 in attendance to view and discuss this video.

Most participants related that the recent uptick in gun violence in our own area or a personal connection to an act of gun violence — such as the Virginia Tech mass shooting — influenced their decision to attend the study. Our discussion topics included: the huge increase in numbers of gun deaths since 2019, gun violence as a public health issue and the implications of such an approach, risk factors for gun violence, the long-standing relationship between violence and place, including micro-geographic areas (in 2015 26% of gun homicides in US occurred in

census tracts that contained only 1.5% of the population), the community wide effects of incidents of gun violence that leave whole neighborhoods traumatized and hopeless, and effective community based interventions. Participants received descriptions of 19 community based interventions programs in Newport News that address some facet of the multilayered problem. Finally each person was given the resource 10 Things You Can Do To Prevent Gun Violence and encouraged to personally commit to some form of action.



The guest speakers will be the Rev. Warren J. Lesane, Jr., Executive Presbyter/Stated Clerk, Synod of the Mid-Atlantic and the Rev. Terri McDowell Ott, Editor and Publisher of the *Presbyterian Outlook*. Choir members from across PEVA will come together to form the choir for the service. Green Acres Presbyterian Church is located at 3135 Hanley Ave., Portsmouth, VA 23703.

Outreach

Individual family needs:

- *Food was provided to one community member.
- *Provided transportation to a church member for doctor appointments.



PORT

*PORT is currently having guest numbers in the high 80s. They are registering as many as 17 new guests each night. In the first seven weeks, 24 families entered PORT, which is just one less than the total number of families in the 2021-22 season. As one of the directors said, "People are coming out of the woodwork from other areas also. MANY more of the guests are incontinent and disabled, using walkers and crutches, and MANY more with mental health issues than in the past. In the first seven weeks, the B sites, which are available for overflow, have been used for two weeks."

Foodbank

- *The Virginia Peninsula Foodbank hit a remarkable milestone with 200 million meals distributed due to the help of so many organizations and community support.
- *The warehouse is not supplied with as much food as it has been in the past, but there has definitely been more food available in the recent month. Hoping this is going to be a trend that will continue.

THRIVE

- *THRIVE distributed more than a half a million dollars in 2022 in financial relief for stable housing, childcare, and transportation.
- *Fifty thousand dollars was raised by 150 donors to provide Christmas for 650 children. Each child was provided a \$75 gift card to Walmart so the parents could give their children a Christmas they otherwise wouldn't receive.
- *Food Pantry needs: mac-n-cheese, canned chicken, mixed vegetables, and cereal.

Paul's Ministry

*Christmas food for 130 children and 109 adults was delivered to Paul's Mobile Home Park on December 19. This included Christmas dinner for the whole family and breakfast and lunch for the children for the 10 days they were out of school and not receiving free meals. Smithfield Foods provided us 40 hams for the Christmas dinners. The majority of the Christmas gifts were delivered later that week due to late shipments. Prime Timers purchased some adorable small stuffed toys for the children, as well. Many thanks to all of the volunteers for taking time out of their busy holiday schedules to help inventory and wrap gifts, pack food, and deliver all of the goodies to the families.

Clothing and More Giveaway

*The Clothing and More Giveaway on December 4 was successful. Thank you to the 50 volunteers who set up and cleaned up. The team has decided to do three events in 2023, instead of four. The date for the first event will be Sunday, April 2, 2023.

Menchville House

- *The 'Adopt-A-Family' program was a great success. With that program and other donations, there was a wonderful Christmas celebration for the families this year.
- *A true Christmas miracle occurred when a donation of \$25,000 was made from a couple that wanted to assist with paying the mortgage for Menchville House.


