








Stewardship

Adult Sunday School Class



PORT

- ◆ DUPC starts hosting PORT from March 1—March 15. Dinner and a breakfast bag will be provided to the guests by DUPC for one day each week. The congregation stepped up and volunteered not only for the two days DUPC is responsible for, but also for two additional days where partner churches were not available.
- DUPC has been donating needed items like clothing, suitcases, and hygiene items for the PORT guests.

Paul's Ministry

• Some of the children of Paul's Mobile Homes Park were involved in playing basketball and cheerleading through the Upward Sports program at Warwick Memorial United Methodist Church. The season ended on February 18, and several of the children have expressed an interest in playing soccer in the fall program that will be held at DUPC.

Bus Transportation

• The bus transported children from Paul's Mobile Homes Park to FWF.

Foodbank

◆ The Black Panthers started the first and most successful Free Breakfast for Children Program in 1969. These committed individuals fed over 20,000 children nationally in the program's first year. This program brought attention to the limited scope of the national School Breakfast Program. Later, it helped pressure Congress to authorize the National School Breakfast Program for all public schools in 1975. This program today helps feed over 14.57 million children before school. (This article was featured on the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank's Facebook page.)

THRIVE

- This year is the organization's 50th year of service on the Peninsula. They now have 80 church partners, dozens of corporate and foundation partners and 100 weekly volunteers. This summer they are hoping to move to their new location that they will share with the Boys and Girls Club. The building will require three months of renovation. THRIVE will begin a capital campaign to cover the cost of the purchase and the renovation so that most of the resources can go to the public. If you would like to help, they will need groups to paint, do minor renovations, and contribute to their capital campaign.
- Food Pantry needs: cereal, jelly, canned tuna/chicken, and ramen noodles.

• Ongoing needs: laundry detergent, dishwashing liquid, cleaning products, shampoo, and body wash.

WHAT IS FARMWORKER AWARENESS WEEK?

National Farmworker Awareness Week (NFAW) is a week of action for communities and individuals to bring attention to farmworkers and honor them for the contributions they make to our daily lives and to raise awareness of the challenges they face.

WHAT IS THE NAT'L LONG-SLEEVE SHIRT DRIVE?

The National Long Sleeve Shirt Drive is an activity that is part of a larger awareness campaign, Farmworker Awareness Week (NFAW) celebrate this year from March 25-31, 2023. During this week-long celebration, our goal is to collect as many long-sleeve shirts as possible nationwide. As well as, to educate the public and the communities where farmworkers live, and work about the occupational hazards farmworkers encounter and rouse them into donating long-sleeve shirts.

The long-sleeve shirts collected during this week of action will be distributed by our network of trainers with key materials during their pesticide safety and heat stress prevention training throughout the year.

The distribution of the shirts will help reinforce the importance of wearing adequate work clothing to help protect farmworkers from pesticide exposure and heat-related illnesses.

WHY LONG-SLEEVE SHIRTS?

Our nation's 2.5 million farmworkers face long hours of arduous work putting their health and safety at risk due to exposure to dangerous pesticides and heat stress.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency indicates that over 20,000 cases of doctor-diagnosed pesticide poisoning are reported yearly.

A gently used long-sleeve shirt can help prevent exposure to pesticides by covering the skin which is the most common route of pesticide poisoning due to its exposure.

Shirts must be: Light Color-Natural Fabric-Long Sleeve

A labeled container to collect shirts will be placed in the Narthex beginning March 25.
