Session Meeting Summary for September 14, 2023

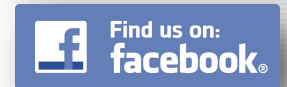
- Approved DUPC financial report through August 31, 2023.

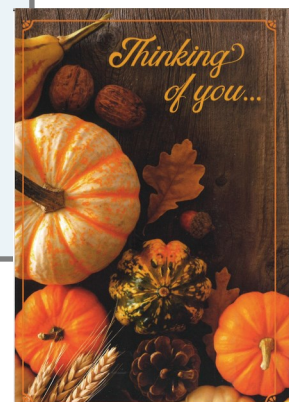

DUPC's Collection Deadline: **November 12, 2023**

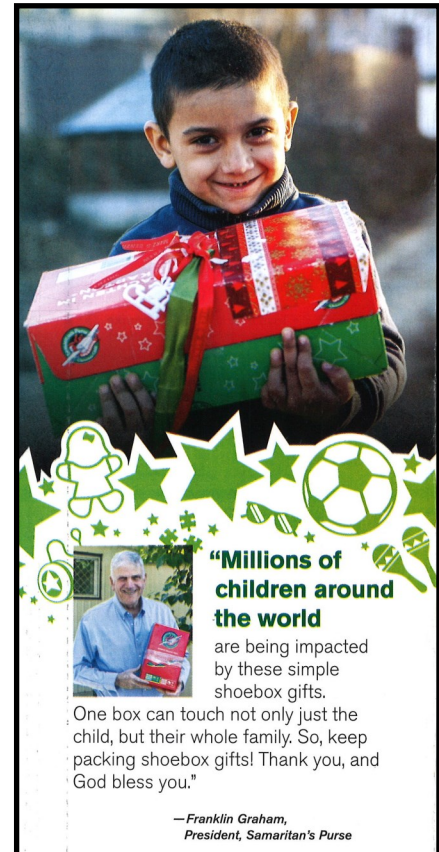

Faith Weaver Friends (FWF)—Begins in November

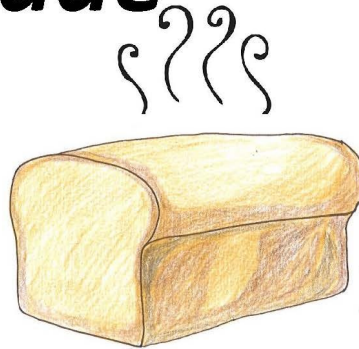

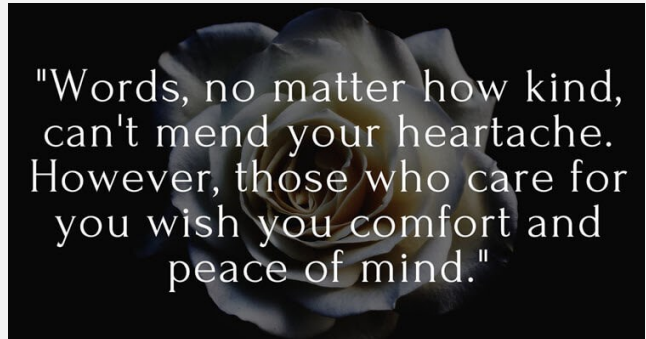


