This new initiative of our church is part of the Onesimus Project and Grant. Thank you to all our volunteers.













Summer Ministry

* The Summer Enrichment program began on July 11 and will continue until August 17, with the exception of the week of Vacation Bible School, July 31-August 4. Eligible students are those who have completed a year of pre-k through students who will be entering the 9th grade in the fall. The courses are integrated units of study (language arts, math, science, social studies, and the fine arts for all students pre-k through those who will enter 5th grade in the fall. Students who will be entering 6th-9th grades get language arts and math. Currently there are approximately 43 students enrolled. The program is Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10:00 a.m.-12:15 p.m. A bag lunch is provided for each student every day.


THRIVE

- * To illustrate the enormity of the food insecurity, THRIVE receives 40 requests for food in the first five minutes of each day. They will now only take online requests for food, so that they can accommodate their regular clients as well.
- Out of 2000 applications submitted, THRIVE's facility has been selected as one of 100 projects for the Lowe's Hometown Projects across the country. \$100,000 will be awarded to THRIVE toward future renovations needed in their new facility.

August—Red Letter Christian Podcasts (Red Letter Christians was founded by Tony Campolo and Shane Claiborne in 2007 with the aim of bringing together evangelicals who believe in the importance of insisting on issues of social justice mentioned by Jesus and printed in red in many Bibles.) First podcast is "The Image of God in Every Person."

September — The Things that Make for Peace, a 5 week Bible study to accompany the denomination wide Season of Peace from September 3-October 1.

October—Matthew Desmond's *Poverty, By America* book study—possibly wider study—with other churches? with Presbytery?

November—"Doctrine of Discovery" study in observance of Native American Heritage Month using materials recommended by PCUSA.


