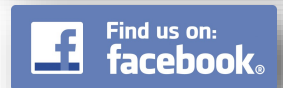

- Approved DUPC financial report through July 31, 2023.
- Approved DUPP financial report through July 31, 2023.
- Approved Stated Session Meeting minutes of July 13, 2023.
- Approved the motion beginning with the Class of 2026 and continuing forward the number of Session members for each class will be reduced from six (6) to five (5).
- Approved the motion to accept the report from Commissioned Ruling Elders Doug Spruill and Keith Pennell from the meeting of the 134th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia held at Wycliffe Presbyterian Church, Virginia Beach, VA, Tuesday, July 25, 2023, be received with thanks for their service.
- Approved the motion to purchase a new HVAC unit to replace one of the two units in Second Hall. (At this time, one company has given us a bid and they did not offer a suggestion to repair rather than replace. The Facilities Committee will explore with other companies whether the unit is repairable and if that is advisable.) The Facilities Committee will get two additional bids for a replacement unit and the Session authorizes them to accept the bid they believe is best in terms of equipment, quality, warranty, cost, and other factors. The Session approves spending up to \$8,000, understanding this will exceed the Facilities budget for 2023.

We often speak of the questions we want to ask Jesus. In this series we will turn the tables and consider the questions Jesus asked people in the Gospels and how those questions address us.

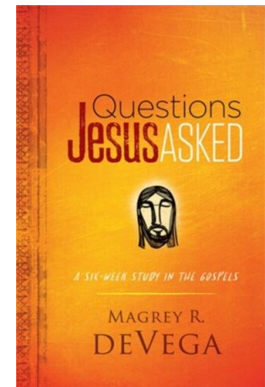
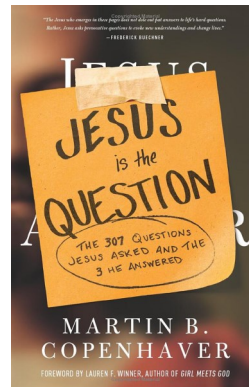

Peace and Global Witness Special Offering—October 1



Farmers rely on tools to bring in a successful crop—tools like resources to control weeds, fight pests or build healthy soil. Kotema (kō-tā-muh), a farmer on Nui (nū-ē) Island, one of a group of low-lying Islands in the South Pacific Ocean that make up the small nation of Tuvalu (tū-vah-loo), found that he had nothing left in his toolkit to counteract the devastating impact of climate change on the family farm. Having been battered beyond hope, he had no choice but to uproot his family from their home, culminating in their forced migration.

Maina Talia (mīn-uh tuh-lē-uh), a former International Peacemaker for the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program, said, “For people who have no choice other than to leave their homes, there aren’t just financial, agricultural and practical implications, but moral implications as well because they’ve been living in a place for their entire lives. This is where they’re attached to; and, when they move on a small island, they are also intruding into other people’s space, creating internal conflicts.”

Because Tuvalu is especially vulnerable to tropical cyclones, rising sea levels and global pollution, some 45% of its residents—like Kotema’s family—have been displaced. Maina works with various nongovernmental organizations, including the Pacific Conference of Churches and the Tuvalu Christian Church, and was instrumental in securing funding for an early warning system to communicate during cyclones. He sees the concept of neighbor in Luke 10, the “Good Samaritan,” as intimately related to his pursuit of peace. He said, “In the context of climate change and geopolitics, our neighbor is no longer someone living next door to us, but rather someone who is impacted by our actions.”

Maina’s call to peacemaking—including addressing the escalating economic, moral, food security and safety issues that result from the impact of climate change—is made possible, in part, by gifts to the Peace & Global Witness Offering, traditionally received on World Communion Sunday, which this year falls on Oct. 1.

This Offering is unique in that half of it is directed to peacemaking and global witness efforts at the national church level to address critical issues around the world. Twenty-five percent is retained by congregations like ours for local peace and reconciliation work, and 25% goes to mid councils for similar ministries on the regional level. With this year’s portion of our offering, we will contribute to a local organization that promotes relational peace.

For Maina, peacemaking is grounded in the biblical question “Who is my neighbor?” He embodies Christ’s call to peace, love and justice as it is exemplified by Matthew 25. As do we. Please give generously to help our neighbors—those next door, down the street and across the globe. For when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.

Onesimus Projects Update:



THRIVE will move into their new facility in the fall, and the Rotary clubs will be able to renovate several of the rooms in their Community Connection wing.

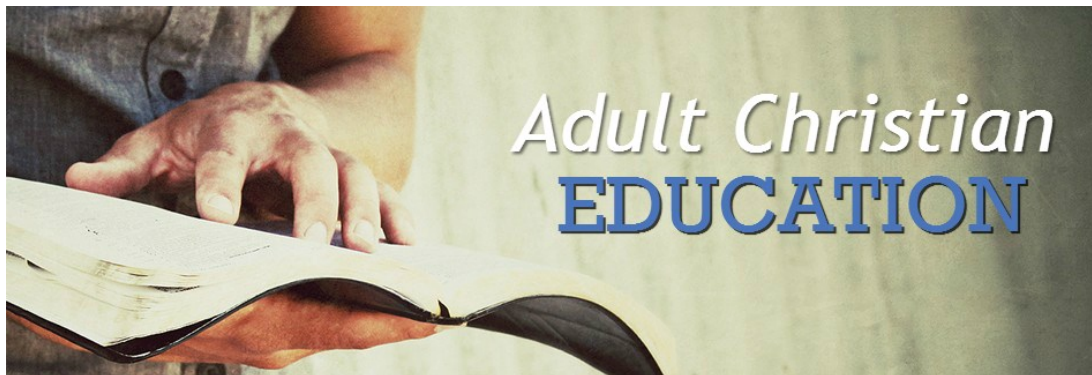

My Star Word—September Reflections

Start the new “school” year with your star word in your “backpack”

- ◆ Even if you’re not in school, September seems to start the year in many ways. Keep your star word in mind as you reset yourself and your routines for the school year.
- ◆ This is the time of year we often reflect on seasons as we transition from summer to autumn. What season of life are you in right now? How does this word fit with your current season of life?
- ◆ Cut out a paper leaf (or just bring in a real one from your yard once they start falling!) and write your word on it. Think about how the word has traveled with you through all these seasons and how it can move forward through more seasons with you.

Adult Sunday School Class

The fall quarter of Ancient Words, our adult Bible study, begins September 3 and continues through November. Our study focuses on New Testament texts that reflect how Jesus’ teaching fulfills Mosaic Law. The class meets Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15 in the Conference Room.



Adult Spiritual Formation—*Keeping Current as a Christian*

The class offers a variety of topics for discussion that are not only current in society but also in the work and ministry of the PCUSA Mission Agency (think Matthew 25, for example). We use a variety of resources as springboards for conversations.

September —*The Things that Make for Peace*, a 5-week Bible study to accompany the denomination wide Season of Peace from September 3-October 1. (See below.)

October—Matthew Desmond’s *Poverty, By America* book study—possibly wider study—with other churches? with Presbytery?

November—“Doctrine of Discovery” study in observance of Native American Heritage Month using materials recommended by PCUSA.



Each year the Presbyterian Church (USA) observes a four week [Season of Peace](#). This year, the season begins Sunday, September 3, 2023 and ends on World Communion Sunday, October 1, 2023. The theme is drawn from Psalm 23: “You are with me.” Resources for the journey are designed to help participants explore practices for building peace on every scale. From the personal level to global issues, these reflections, prayers, and studies will help grow the faith and witness of the whole church.

This year’s daily devotional, *Path of Peace*, celebrates the 40th anniversary of the Presbyterian Church (USA)’s [Commitment to Peacemaking](#). Begun in 1983, the [Commitment](#) has offered a tool to Presbyterian congregations and worshiping communities to shape their peacemaking ministries. The contributors to the 2023 *Path of Peace* reflections have each in their time been involved in the peacemaking ministries of the Presbyterian Church (USA). You have the option of subscribing to these reflections for daily delivery into your inbox or downloading and printing the written portion of the reflections as a devotional resource.

The Things That Make for Peace is a five-week adult study focusing on the inner and outer paths to peace as foundational to faithful discipleship. Each session has a “dig deeper” section for study throughout the week. The “Keeping Current as a Christian” class will begin this study September 3, 2023. All materials will be provided.
