



THRIVE

- THRIVE now has "Thursday Night THRIVE Takeover" twice a month where groups can adopt a Thursday night at THRIVE and extended hours are offered. Volunteers can greet and assist, pack food bags, or help load food bags into vehicles.
- Last month, THRIVE served more people across all of their programs (numbers of people served, pounds of food distributed, and critical bill assistance) and in higher quantities than they did in all of 2016!
- Pantry items needed: applesauce, spaghetti sauce, pasta, and cereal.

<u>Virginia Peninsula Foodbank (VPF)</u>

- In the spirit of the Super Bowl, Derrick Nnadi, a defensive tackle for the winning Kansas City Chiefs and a native of Hampton Roads, helped the VPF a few years ago kick off their SPIKE Summer Feeding program with the Hampton Roads Youth Foundation. This program helps feed thousands of children in the summer months when school is out.
- On April 11, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. Tastefully Yours, the VPF's largest annual fundraiser, will be held at the Hampton Roads Convention Center. This is a premier food tasting event with samplings from over 30 food establishments, craft beer, wine, live music, mini Vegas, photo booths and more. Menchville House

- Since July of 2023, Menchville house has assisted 155 people (63 adults and 92 children) which included 48 families.
- Current needs: body wash, zip lock bags of all sizes, 55 gallon trash bags, blankets (twin/queen) and pillows.







LINK/PORT

- LINK is in continuous need of warm clothing for men and women for the PORT season. On
 the first night of the two weeks DUPC was hosting, our Clothing Closet served 66 guests with
 up to three items of clothing they selected. The clothing was available for a total of 8 nights.
 There is a box available in the Narthex for any donations, and someone from DUPC can
 transport those to the next churches that are hosting PORT.
- DUPC welcomed between 100-110 guests each night. The temperatures have been in the 30's as they leave the next mornings before 6:00 a.m. The partner churches had wonderful dinners to provide them, and seconds were available on most nights. Many guests expressed their appreciation for all of the efforts to keep them warm and well fed, clothed, and cared for. It was an eye-opening and heart felt experience for many volunteers and a wonderful way to show God's love.





WHAT IS FARMWORKER AWARENESS WEEK?

National Farmworker Awareness Week (NFAW) is a week of action for communities and individuals to bring attention to farmworkers and honor them for the contributions they make to our daily lives and to raise awareness of the challenges they face.

WHAT IS THE NAT'L LONG-SLEEVE SHIRT DRIVE?

The National Long Sleeve Shirt Drive is an activity that is part of a larger awareness campaign, Farmworker Awareness Week (NFAW) celebrate this year from March 25-31, 2024. During this week-long celebration, our goal is to collect as many long-sleeve shirts as possible nationwide. As well as, to educate the public and the communities where farmworkers live, and work about the occupational hazards farmworkers encounter and rouse them into donating long-sleeve shirts.

The long-sleeve shirts collected during this week of action will be distributed by our network of trainers with key materials during their pesticide safety and heat stress prevention training throughout the year.

The distribution of the shirts will help reinforce the importance of wearing adequate work clothing to help protect farmworkers from pesticide exposure and heat-related illnesses.

WHY LONG-SLEEVE SHIRTS?

Our nation's 2.5 million farmworkers face long hours of arduous work putting their health and safety at risk due to exposure to dangerous pesticides and heat stress.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency indicates that over 20,000 cases of doctor-diagnosed pesticide poisoning are reported yearly.

A gently used long-sleeve shirt can help prevent exposure to pesticides by covering the skin which is the most common route of pesticide poisoning due to its exposure.

Shirts must be: Light Color-Natural Fabric-Long Sleeve
