

Pentecost Offering/Day of Pentecost—Sunday, May 19, 2024

A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. Forty percent (40%) of the Pentecost Offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining sixty percent (60%) is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Session approved 40 percent (40%) of the upcoming Pentecost Offering for the Menchville House. The Pentecost Offering will be collected until the end of May.

<u>Menchville House</u>, a 501(c) 3 organization, is a forty-six-bed emergency housing facility for homeless families located in the Denbigh area of Newport News.

Menchville House started in April 1998 as the vision of three women to establish a shelter for homeless women and their children. The agency works with other homeless service providers and social service agencies that offer families the services and support needed to return to self-sufficiency. Since 1998, over 4,000 families have moved from hurt to hope to become healthy, independent, and contributing members of their communities.

Music Ministry Children's Choir/Children's Handchimes

This new music opportunity takes place during the regular children's choir time (Wednesdays, 5-5:45 p.m.). Handchimes are a simpler version of handbells, and our new chime choir will perform during worship this spring. Your child will learn how to read music and play an instrument, while having a lot of fun. All children are welcome, even if they did not sing in children's choir previously.

Outreach



Individual/Family Needs

- Provided rental assistance for a DUPC member.
- Provided transportation from school to home several times for a community member associated with DUPC.
- The congregation collected grocery bags for THRIVE's Market.
- The congregation collected long-sleeve shirts for migrant field workers to protect their skin from pesticides and overexposure from the sun.
- DUPC collected household items for LINK that were needed for individuals being moved into housing.
- Two homeless individuals and two community families received food and non-food items from DUPC's pantry.

Paul's Ministry

• Children from Paul's Mobile Homes Park were transported by DUPC members to Sunday School, Upward Soccer, Chime Choir, and the Easter Egg Hunt in April.



THRIVE

- On March 19, THRIVE had their ribbon cutting ceremony for their new facility on Nettles Drive. The event was well attended by many local organizations and community members, and WVEC 13 News and WSKY 4 TV were present to cover the event. THRIVE was pleased to bring awareness to the food and financial insecurity in the community. The new facility offers The Market, the Peninsula's first free grocery store. In addition to the groceries available, raised bed gardens full of fresh produce and spices are grown on site. Residents from Newport News, Hampton, and York County can shop at the market once a month by appointment and currently over 2,000 people are shopping there each month. In addition, their Level Up financial wing offers financial assistance, education, and a conference room to host training workshops, and free books are available in a children's library.
- THRIVE is all about increasing community involvement and resources to achieve their goals. Their new partnership with Riverside Hospital is focused on the community garden initiative and allows THRIVE to increase their effectiveness with the 25,000 clients they assist each year.
- Pantry items needed: canned beans, vegetables, fruits, soups, rice, pasta, other non-perishable grains, peanut butter and other nut butters, boxed meals, pasta sauces, and pancake mix and syrup.

LINK

- In 2023:
 - 100+ veterans were provided assistance
 - 46,000 lbs. of food were distributed
 - 750+ individuals were kept off of the streets in the 2022-2023 season
 - 98 people were permanently housed through CANLINK Supportive Housing Program
- DUPC received from LINK, \$5,000 for hosting PORT for two weeks (\$2,500.00 per week). In addition, \$1,200 will be reimbursed to the 12 partner churches who assisted DUPC during the two weeks, and \$100 per church, to help with their food expenses.

PORT

• PORT began 33 years ago, with seven churches, assisting a homeless population of 13 men and 4 women, providing them a place to stay in the winter months, since people were dying on the streets. Here are some of the statistics from the 2023-2024 season:

• There were 698 clients served this year, a slight decrease from last year. This may have been due to slightly warmer weather.

LINK of Hampton Roads Emergency resources for the homeless and at risk.

- LINK implemented the Housing Trust Fund (HTF) which identifies individuals that are most in need of permanent housing. This year, 12 clients were put in stable housing situations during the PORT season.
- Clients came from Newport News (515), Hampton (105), Norfolk (17) and Williamsburg (19), as well as other areas.
- There was a 5% increase in clients 55 years and older.
- There were 233 women (a slight decrease from last year), 458 men, and 4 individuals that were Trans or Nonbinary.
- This season, 50% had no income at all.
- There were 476 guests that were black, 157 that were white, and 65 of mixed races.
- There were numerous families this season, some including up to five individuals. There was a child born in January to one family. With LINK's efforts, 19 of the 24 households either successfully resolved their situation or were transitioned into stable housing.
- 71 veterans were guests in PORT this season.



Evangelism

• There were over 600 views on Facebook and over 200 on YouTube during March.



World Missions






