Agents of Grace Sunday was October 19. On that day the church was a sea of blue, with many of our members and friends wearing their Agents of Grace T-shirts.

Agents of Grace, a special day held annually in October, is when church members gather to do a little extra for the church and others. It is a day of fellowship and working together to accomplish specific goals. **This year, 90 people served on ministry teams. Others donated food, cleaning supplies, and/or money.** This inter-generational event involved most of the church.

The **"Lunch Bunch"** team, led by Becky Skaar, served a great lunch and then the ministry teams were off to serve. The "Lunch Bunch," besides preparing and setting up for the lunch, handled all the clean-up and dishwashing.

The "Hymn Sing" team went to sing for residents of The Hidenwood. Led by Jane Martin, this group did two performances (one of which was for the Memory Care Unit) and brightened the lives of those who listened to and sang along with hymns.

The "Hallmark Moment" team was busy writing and illustrating cards of encouragement. Our team co-leaders were Sarah Phillips and Nancy Phillips.

Two teams worked outside, enhancing the beauty of the church property. The "Landscaping Around the Church" team, led by Keith Pennell, planted several new bushes while the "For the Beauty of the Earth" team, led by Sandra Kochersperger, laid plastic sheeting to prepare the area for a wild flower garden in the spring. (The garden will be between the soccer field and Denbigh Boulevard.)

The "Menchville House" team, led by Sandi Murawski, prepared and delivered a great meal to the residents of this residential home for homeless men, women, and children.

The "Visitations" team, led by Marlene Ferri, visited church members who are homebound or in assisted living at various residential communities.

The "Crop Walk" team was led by Kathy Baldwin. She and fellow walkers joined others for a three-mile walk to support Church World Service. The team members delivered our church's contribution of \$525.

The "THRIVE" team was composed of nine adults and 11 children and led by Jean Kyle. They sorted and counted all the generous donations of food and cleaning supplies. Even the smallest child helped carry the donations to the church bus for delivery to THRIVE.

Donors who contributed funds, food, and cleaning supplies made the ministry of the "THRIVE" and "Crop Walk" teams possible.


