- Two donated bikes were delivered to children involved in DUPC youth activities.

Paul's Ministry

- In August, members of DUPC transported children from Paul's Mobile Home Park and surrounding areas to attend Sunday School, Worship, Summer Educational Ministry classes and field trip to Surge Adventure Park.

Agents of Grace

- Agents of Grace will be celebrated on Sunday, October 19. This is DUPC's opportunity to go out into our community to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Please consider volunteering for one of the many ways you could serve others.

Soccer Clinic

- DUPC hosted a free soccer clinic presented with Virginia Legacy Soccer Club on Saturday, August 16, for coaches, prospective coaches, and players. Participants will learn skills and refine old ones with the Peninsula's leading traveling soccer club.



School Schools/Backpacks

- Connie Hunt purchased school supplies for children this year. The schools no longer provide the required clear backpacks, so clear ones were purchased for students in need. The backpacks were filled with the school supplies and Connie delivered them to children from Paul's Mobile Home Park and surrounding areas. Over \$1,000 was donated for this ministry from the congregation and other sources.

Summer Educational Ministry

- Our Summer Educational Enrichment Program was well attended. Classes for children who recently completed pre-Kindergarten and first grade began July 14. Children who recently completed grades 2-5 began their classes on July 22. The program ran Tuesdays through Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. - 12:15 p.m. until August 7. Thirty-one children were enrolled this year. Nancy Kerns had eight preschoolers. Sandi Murawski led eight children in kindergarten and first grade; Lois Ballman worked with six second and third graders; and Claire Dick taught nine students who had completed fourth and fifth grades. Classroom helpers included Katie McIlroy, Jennifer Lloyd, and Lynn Ardary. Joe Bender, Debbie Ames, Pastor Deborah Dail, and Dale Pennell provided transportation. Debbie Ames and her kitchen helpers, Martha Miller, Rosemary Murphy, Marlene Ferri, Moses Lloyd, Sho Bender, and Connie Hunt prepared bag lunches to cover Monday-Friday for thirty program participants as well as six children who did not participate in the program, but were siblings of students. If you happen to see any of these folks, please take a moment to thank them for all they did to provide education and fun experiences for children. The students were treated to a trip to the Surge Adventure Park on August 12. Twenty-six students enjoyed two hours of fun, and bag lunches were provided for the students as they departed.

THRIVE

- THRIVE is trying to stay brave and relentless in their support of the community while facing uncertainty. With EBT and Medicaid cuts beginning in November, they are expecting an increase in the requests for help. Because of the ripple effect, their key partners are facing cuts that will impact THRIVE's food sourcing and educational support.
- THRIVE has a Wish List on Amazon. Support THRIVE from the comfort of your home by ordering items online. The items will be sent directly to them, and then distributed to families in need. Go to <https://a.co/hRKRNIe>.
- Some of the impact THRIVE has had in the first six months of this year are: \$302,606 in financial assistance, 243 financial coaching sessions and 17,538 people received food from The Market.
- Pantry needs: jelly, spaghetti, box potato sides, canned collards, pudding mix.



Menchville House

- The Menchville House Annual Fundraising Dinner was held on Tuesday, July 29 at Menchville Baptist Church. Ten members of DUPC attended. The dinner was catered by Carrabba's Italian Restaurant. The two testimonies given were especially heart warming this year. One guest had been homeless for 12 years, and because of the assistance from Menchville House, she is now in her own apartment, her very first home. The second guest was a young mother that had a two year old and an infant, and was living in her car. She is now employed and has her own home. And for the first time, at the closing of the evening, everyone stood up, held hands, and sang Amazing Grace. Praise God for the Menchville House and their mission.
- The Priscilla circle donated \$100 to the Menchville House to send a child to the YMCA for camp this summer.

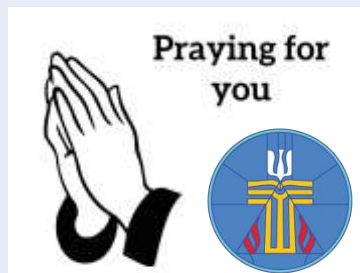

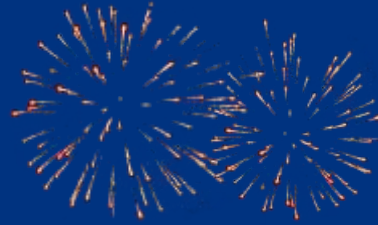
